Mytholmroyd Flood Alleviation Scheme



The Environment Agency is working in partnership with Calderdale Council and VBA to deliver the Mytholmroyd Flood Alleviation Scheme. The aim of this newsletter is to update you on our progress with the scheme.

Area E - Caldene Bridge

Work is expected to start soon at the entrance to the Community Centre to tie the area into the new Caldene Avenue road layout. Access will be maintained throughout, but VBA staff may be required to direct traffic and pedestrians at times so please follow their instructions.

Stone pitching to the river bed and cladding to the new walls has been paused due to the recent high river levels (photo right). We will continue to progress this work when river levels allow.



Reinstatement next to Burnley Road is almost complete. The area includes flood glass installed in the wall, stone paving, resin bound sections, a tree planter, bench and refuse bin (photo left).

The flood wall between Calder Grove and the new bridge has been installed. Work on the small section between the Community Centre car park and the wall at Streamside Fold will commence soon.

Access steps to the EA river level gauge will also be installed here.

Area F – upstream of Caldene Bridge

A flood gate has been installed downstream of White Houses. This will remain locked unless required by the Environment Agency for temporary access to the river channel for activities such as inspection of flood defence assets and clearance of vegetation posing a flood risk.

Area L1 - Brearley

Work has continued on the left bank (looking downstream) to construct and clad the new flood walls protecting properties upstream of the bridge (photo right) and the industrial estate downstream. On the right bank, the Mill Hill river wall is currently being pointed and one-way flap valves fitted.
